

## Email for Canning in Class

One of the easiest ways to can to collect donations is by asking the people around you, like your classmates. Speaking and passing around your can in class is a quick way to collect donations, especially on a push day. Consider putting your Venmo name on your can as well! Prior to canning in class, you should email your professor to ask for permission to speak and pass your can around. If you are having trouble writing that email request, use the following template as an example:

Dear Professor [insert professor name here],

## Letter Asking for Donations

As college students, often our first thought as to where to go to ask for donations is social media or Venmo. That's a great way to reach some people, but many people, especially adults, may not find this their preferred way to be reached out to for a donation. It is also significantly less personal since you are posting and reaching out to a mass audience instead of reaching out to individuals. Consider crafting a personal email instead to a group of possible donors. You could email them all individually, or you could write unique emails to each of them. Regardless, it is a more personal ask that is likely to help you reach a wider audience than you might online.

## Thank You Note

Thanking your donors is such an important thing to do, because it shows them that their gift mattered to you and shows them how their donation made an impact. Additionally, it can create a long term donor who continues to support you year after year, because they saw how much the donation meant to you and to the program. Thank you notes should be send promptly, within a week or two of the donation being made. Below is a thank you template, but note that you should not simply copy this word for word. You can make it longer or shorter depending on who the donor is and how well you know them. Be sure to make your thank you notes as personal as you can, adding a bit of your own story to it to make it more meaningful.
