

# Patient Academics

Offering academic support to patients through a certified teacher







Orlando Health Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children has always strived towards the goal to help kids to remain kids even while in the hospital. This not only includes social activities and proper time for play, but also maintaining patients' education. Academics play a fundamental role in the development of a child, and time away from school can easily disrupt a child's learning and development.

To help reduce added stress from extended time away from school, Orlando Health Arnold Palmer offers patients academic support through an in-house certified teacher who can provide assistance when a child or teen will miss school while in the hospital.



Orlando Health Arnold Palmer's in-house teacher helps families understand and navigate the various options for receiving hospital/homebound instruction through the public school system or with virtual schooling. Our teacher provides individual instruction and group activities for patients during an extended hospital stay.

### **Meet Eddie**

Eddie Nasello is our full-time certified teacher at Orlando Health Arnold Palmer. Eddie has been working in education for over 15 years and became the first full-time teacher at our hospital in July of 2018.

Eddie assists patients at each grade level, from Kindergarten through 12th grade, and in any subject area. Supporting the over-all well being of our patients, Eddie visits students in all units within the hospital, though some areas, such as oncology, tend to have more patients who are in need of long-term academic support.



### **Putting Families at Ease**

When a child enters the hospital, nothing is more important than their health and well being. For both parents and patients, navigating the stress of a healthcare plan can become so overwhelming that other priorities in life fall out of focus. That is precisely where our certified teacher's critical role comes into play, making sure the patient's education does not fall by the wayside.

To help walk them through their situation, our certified teacher will let patient families know their options and address any concerns parents may have for their child. This allows us to provide right, custom level of support needed by each family.



Our goal is to help children and teens continue to advance academically, while providing normal learning opportunities throughout their medical experience.

## **One-On-One Support**

Prior to Eddie joining our team at Orlando Health Arnold Palmer, patients were limited in the academic support they could receive. For students in the public school system who were eligible to apply for hospital homebound study, a teacher would visit with the student and assist them with their learning. When the COVID-19 pandemic hit, these visits became virtual, which made having an in-hospital teacher a valuable resource for students.

## There's no substitute for having direct face-to-face learning with a teacher.

For private school students who wish to remain enrolled in their school, there is no option for hospital homebound instruction. To continue receiving assistance with their education, our teacher at Orlando Health Arnold Palmer will coordinate with the patient's teachers to ensure the student stays on-track academically.
